

The Tabernacle Illness Policy

Symptoms/Do Not Bring	May Return
Chicken Pox	All blisters have dried and crusted, (usually 6 days) fallen off and scars have healed.
Croup If child has severe, uncontrolled coughing, wheezing or difficulty in breathing.	No fever or wheezing that is being controlled by medication. Breathing is within normal limits.
Diarrhea	24 hours with no diarrhea
Fever	24 hours with no fever
Fifth's Disease Rash may still appear up to three weeks.	Child is no longer contagious once rash appears.
Flu like symptoms Fever (temperature of 100 and above), cough, sore throat, body aches, vomiting, diarrhea	24 hours symptom free
Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease The usual period from infection to onset of symptoms is 3-5 days. Fever is often the first symptom. Sneezing and coughs can spread the virus.	Two weeks after the virus has appeared. There should be no lesions in the mouth or sneezing. Scabs must be dry and without area redness.
Head Lice	Hair has been treated, combed and is completely clear of lice or nits.
Impetigo	24 hours after starting antibiotics and areas should be covered
Pink Eye Itching and burning of the eyes, redness and tearing of the eyes, sensitivity of light, swollen eyelids and thick discharge that makes the eyes stick together.	Infection must be completely gone.
Rash Body rash with fever, that spreads quickly, has open or weeping wounds or suspected to be contagious.	24 hours with no rash
Ringworms	24 hours after starting treatment- Upon returning, area must be covered for 2 days.
Runny Nose	If clear and no colored discharge.
Strep Throat	24 hours after starting antibiotics
Vaccine Preventable Diseases Measles, Mumps, German Measles, Whooping Cough	When Doctor says the child is no longer contagious.
Vomiting	Child is tolerating oral fluids and has not thrown up for 24 hours.
